


Easy to reach

Although centrally located not far from downtown Munich, the indoor market is easy to reach from outside the city as well. The “Mittlerer Ring”, or middle ring road, leads directly to national roads and the motorways around Munich.

The "belly" of Munich


Großmarkthalle München has a long tradition of offering a wide variety of fresh, high quality produce in a thriving business atmosphere. In February 1912, this area saw the opening of the first four halls in the style of hall 1, under architectural heritage protection for some time.

At the end of the 19th century, the expansion of railways led trade with Italy to flourish. As the Viktualienmarkt food market could no longer handle large quantities of fresh products, the decision was made to establish an indoor wholesale market connected to the railway and near the city centre.



Since then, Großmarkthalle München has served as an international hub for this sector, while becoming the "belly" of Munich. Still today, this creates a very special atmosphere, in which an international feel and openness to the world merge with the charm of Munich and friendliness of Bavaria.

Boasting an abundant offer always up with the times, Großmarkthalle München is now the largest and most successful fruit, vegetable and gourmet food market in all of Germany, any time of year.



Potential

A market with great potential

This international fruit and vegetable market in the heart of Europe spans 310,000 square metres and hosts 400 import and wholesale trade businesses from around the world. In addition to fruit and vegetables, the market also sells flowers and gourmet foods. Local fruit and vegetable agents export products to the rest of Europe as well.

If you are looking for meat, poultry, fish, gourmet foods and wines, nearby Schlachthof München is the place for you.

The numbers clearly demonstrate the economic importance of this fruit and vegetable market, Europe's third largest after those in Paris and Barcelona: approximately 800,000 - 850,000 tonnes of goods worth over €750 million pass through Großmarkthalle München, one of the "Markthallen München" indoor markets, each year and the combined turnover of all merchants based in Großmarkthalle is estimated to total roughly €1.5 billion.

Großmarkthalle München owes its market strength to its wide range of action, which extends from Munich, including the surrounding areas, to the greater regions of southern Germany and Austria. Goods from Großmarkthalle München reach some 5 million people each day.

A closer look

Großmarkthalle München is synonymous with the freshest and highest quality goods. It also boasts a wide variety of products and services:



The six **market halls** host 150 stands selling fruit, vegetables and gourmet foods.



Local and regional growers sell their produce in the **greenhouse hall**.



The **wholesale flower market** offers a wide range of plants, cut flowers and products for nurseries and florists.



Schlacht- und Viehhof is the ideal place to find fine foods of all kinds, from fish and meat to wine.



The **Andechser Markthalle** offers organic products.



The former **sorting centre** in front of the market gates leading to the market plaza now houses gourmet food businesses and retailers.



The former **headquarters of the Fruchthof fruit cooperative**, Munich's oldest tradesmen's district, also stands just outside the plaza. It has been completely redeveloped and transformed into an area for small businesses, art studios and apartments.
